

## Ocean County Library Toms River Branch to Present 'Jersey Devil Palooza'



**TOMS RIVER** – It's notorious, it's downright scary...and it's all ours. Come celebrate Pinelands lore during our all-ages Jersey Devil Palooza at the Ocean County Library Toms River Branch, starting at 10:30 AM Friday, October 20.

Highlighting the family-friendly day of folklore and fun will be an exploration of the legend of the Jersey Devil by Frank Esposito, co-author of <u>The Secret History of the Jersey Devil: How</u> <u>Quakers, Hucksters and Benjamin Franklin Created a Monster</u>.

Also on the schedule of events is a special performance by the WREP troupe ("When Radio Entertained People), a scavenger hunt for teens, a child-friendly Take & Make craft, a Jersey Devil-themed basket of swag to be given away, and more events for all ages.

According to the <u>Pinelands Alliance</u>, tales of the Jersey Devil's origins date back more than 250 years. It's described as kangaroo-like, with the face of a horse on a head the shape of a dog's, bat-like wings, horns and a tail. The demon sis said to lurk in the forests and even in towns, and was the bane of farmers by laying waste to crops and animals.
